






2024 GIVING REPORT


Research

hrough our Global Health Outreach events program, the Foundation brings adult and pediatric cardiac care to areas in need, teaching local clinicians and providing direct patient services to at-risk communities. This year, we are hosting two outreach events. In June, a team of volunteers will travel to Dakar, Senegal and another team will be heading to Bengaluru, India in September. A call for volunteers for both events outlining the scope including specific clinical or language skills that may be necessary for the teams will be announced in March! Recipients will receive a \$1,000 USD travel stipend to support their attendance at the ASE 2025 Scientific Sessions. 2025 EDGES Research Grants Available: APPLICATION OPENS APRIL 2

The application to the 2025 Early-Career Development Grant for Echo Scientists (EDGES) will open April 2. The program awards three grants worth up to \$25,000 USD to fund projects that address a clinical gap in cardiovascular ultrasound imaging through research led by an early-career scientist. There are no specific research themes that will be prioritized, and clinical gaps may include, but are not limited to: new imaging technologies, novel approaches or populations for diagnostic imaging, ultrasound therapy, workflow automation, or patient/practitioner safety. Physicians, PhDs, veterinarians, sonographers, and other healthcare professionals who are within seven years from having completed training are eligible to **apply through June 16**, **2025**, **5:00 PM ET.** The principal investigator must be an active ASE member.
